Marichal "Premium Varietal" wine

The "Premium Varietal" line is produced with hand-picked fruit that reflects the purest expression of each variety. The wines are fresh, young and <u>unoaked</u>.

- Premium Varietal Tannat Canelones is well-suited to grow grapes with heavy, calcareous soils. The Tannat produced here is medium-bodied with a long finish.
- Premium Varietal Merlot is a well-balanced wine with harmonious flavors that are smooth and intense.

Marichal Reserve Collection wine

Specially selected grapes with the potential to make a complex wine are hand-picked and bottled in very limited quantities. The wines are aged in used <u>French oak</u> barrels.

- Reserve Collection Tannat is the perfect example of a new world Uruguayan Tannat.
- Reserve Collection Pinot Noit / Tannat is a unique blend of Pinot Noir and Tannat.

Marichal Grand Reserve Tannat

This is a limited release (3,000 bottles), ultra-premium wine. Complex, intense and full-bodied.

Grand Reserve Tannat "A" is Marichal's top-end
 Tannat, and rivals the best wines produced in Uruguay.

Bordering Brazil and Argentina, the country of Uruguay is home to many small wineries that were first planted by Basque and Italian immigrants as far back as the 1870s. The climate and soil are ideal components for bringing new life to old grape varieties such as Tannat.

Marichal is headed by winemakers Juan Andrés and Alejandro Marichal. The family-owned winery originally established in 1938 and they are now into their third and fourth generation of family winemaking. The vineyards are located at an ideal latitude in the department, or province, of Canelones (15 miles north of Uruguay's capitol, Montevideo) where the warm weather, cool Atlantic breezes and deep clay soil allow varieties like Tannat thrive and achieve unique character.

92 points: Marichal Tannat Grand Reserve "A" 2013

"40 year old, single vineyard (one of the first French Tannat clones planted in Uruguay): rich & ripe, complex nose of primary fruit, chocolate, rosemary and mint. Silky smooth and dense—dark cherry, plum, dried fruit, hints of chocolate, chalky tannins, and a prolonged finish."

91 points: Marichal Tannat Reserve Collection 2013

"The nose shows huckleberry fruit with hints of rosemary and bay leaf, soft on the attack and suave on the palate with layers of dark fruit with tobacco and herbal notes, finishing long and smooth. 70 percent of the wine is aged in barrel for 12 months, 30% new. French (40%) and American (60%) oak."

90 points: Marichal Premium Varietal Tannat 2014
