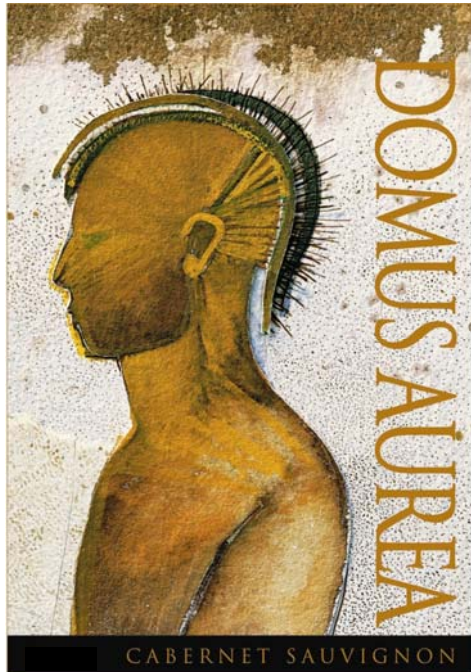


DOMUS AUREA

Domus Aurea Cabernet Sauvignon *Maipo Terroir at Its Finest*



Located in the foothills of the Andes Mountain Range, Clos Quebrada de Macul is recognized as one of the Maipo Valley's finest vineyards. It is here, on the gravelly slopes of a 45-acre single-vineyard, that owners Ricardo and Isabel Peña produce their award-winning Cabernet Sauvignon.

The Peña family's vineyards are divided into five blocks that follow the depth and stoniness of the soil, which are further divided into upper, middle and lower rows. The harvest is not determined by block or row but by vine. The winery also utilizes open-top fermentation and personalized oak aging cycles,

selecting lots with the most character to be the first wines into barrels.

Clos Quebrada de Macul is also the producer of the award-winning Peñalolen family of wines.

Domus Aurea 2005 Cabernet Sauvignon

Made with a blend of 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Merlot, and 4% Cabernet Franc, the 2005 Domus Aurea has a dazzling ruby color and an earthy, balsamic nose with hints of orange zest and chocolate. Aged for 18 months in French oak and another 18 months in the bottle, the Domus is juicy, concentrated, and balanced, with fine, well-integrated tannins. Outstanding with grilled lamb, mushrooms and sweet red peppers.
