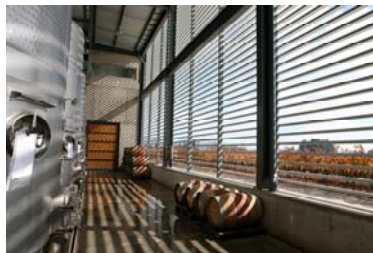

Apaltagua Winery focuses on the distinguished, but lesser known, grape varietal Carmenère. Considered the "lost Bordeaux" variety (as it was originally planted in Bordeaux), Carmenère has proven to be perfectly suited to Chile's longer growing season, which produces exceptionally good wines. Apaltagua's 60-year-old vineyards are located in the prestigious Apalta region of Colchagua, renowned for producing quality red wines.

## Antiyal KUYEN

Maipo Valley, Chile

Antiyal, the original "garage wine" of Chile, is a proprietary blend of Carmenère, Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon. It is acknowledged as one of the finest wines made in South America and it is owned and produced by Alvaro Espinoza, who traditionally makes fewer than 500 cases per year. A biodynamic wine that is bottled unfiltered, Antiyal is a rich, extracted wine that is highly sought by those in the know.

Kuyen, which Espinoza calls his "baby Antiyal," is also organic and biodynamic. It is made in honor of "the ancient traditions and cosmic vision of the people of the earth." The Kuyen blend of Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon is aged in French oak barrels, then bottled and aged an additional six months.

At their state-of-the-art winery, they produce a "Super Chilean" blend of Syrah, Carmenère, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, and Malbec. Ricardo Rivadeneira Hurtado and his team pride themselves on creating a generous red wine full of character and a sense of place.

# CALCU

Colchagua Valley, Chile

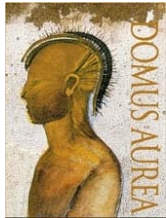

Calcu produces four wines, including a "Super Chilean" blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Carmenère, and Cabernet Franc. Winemakers Alejandro Jofre and Ricardo Rivadeneira capture the diversity of the Colchagua Valley by combining a range of flavors into a single wine. Alejandro and Ricardo artfully blend the mineral notes and fresh acidity of grapes from the Andes foothills with the ripe tannins and red fruit from the center of the valley, and, finally, add richness and body from grapes grown closer to the Pacific Ocean. The resulting red wines are lightly oaked, allowing the grapes' natural, fresh fruit character to shine through.

There, vineyard owners Ricardo and Isabel Peña produce two Cabernet Sauvignons that reflect the distinctive terroir of this region. The Domus Aurea Cabernet has received critical acclaim since its inaugural release in 1996, with each vintage receiving 90+ points in key wine publications. All grapes are hand harvested with meticulous care to guarantee the integrity of the fruit. This is truly a family-owned, boutique winery committed to making wines of personality and verve.

At his Maipo Valley vineyard, Lacaze grows grapes sustainably and organically, uses the best fruit, ages the wine in individually selected barrels, and blends the juice at just the right time.

Pargua's label artwork was created by renowned Chilean artist Benjamin Lira. Like the artwork, which will change with every vintage, Pargua's wines are vibrant, expressive, and harmonious.

The name, which means "stubborn" in Spanish, underscores the burro-like commitment to quality for which the Santos family is famous.*
