Apaltagua Envero Carmenere 2008

Colchagua Valley, Chile

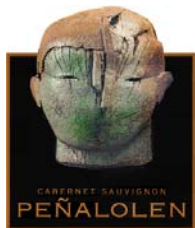
“Ripe and polished, with a delicious core of black Mission fig, macerated black currant and dark plum fruit, all woven with alluring licorice snap, black tea and roasted mesquite notes. The long, fleshy finish lets a tobacco note take over.”

Apaltagua Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon 2009

Colchagua Valley, Chile

“Very solid, led by briar and cassis notes and backed by a core of raspberry, red licorice and sweet spice. Friendly, juicy finish.” 88 points



Penalolen Cabernet Sauvignon 2008

Maipo Valley, Chile

“Fleshy and balanced, displaying good dark currant and mulled plum fruit backed by a broad, toast- and loam-filled finish.” 88 points

Kuyen 2008

Maipo Valley, Chile

“Direct, with medium-weight plum and currant fruit framed with notes of tobacco and cocoa. There’s a hint of loam on the lightly grippy finish.” 87 points



Antiyal 2008

Maipo Valley, Chile

“A solid, grippy style, with lilac, cedar and Kenya AA coffee Notes up front, followed by firm, focused flavors of black currant, tar and licorice root. There’s a nice tug of loam on the finish.”

Ricardo Santos Semillon 2009

Malbec, Argentina

“Racy core of tangerine, beeswax and heather. Lingering note of jasmine. A nice, stylish change of pace.” 87 points

Tercos Torrontes 2009

Mendoza, Argentina

“Fresh, with nice zip to lemon verbena, white peach and tangerine notes. Lightly rounded finish.” 85 points
