ANTIYAL Maipo Valley 2002 91 points
\$50
Lovely aromas of crushed berry, violet and spice. Long finish.

TOP VALUES

VINA PENALOEN Cabernet Sauvignon Maipo Valley 2002 89 points
\$17
Alluring notes of mint, sage and roasted vanilla and coffee beans. Stylish black cherry.

APALTAGUA Envero Colchagua Valley 2003 88 points
\$15
Nice ripe plum and raspberry. Stays fresh through the finish. Well done.

DE MARTINO Carmenère Maipo Valley Legado Reserva 2003 88 points
\$15
Ripe, with clean, fresh, modern-style plum and red currant.
