Ricardo was the first winemaker to export Malbec making it Argentina's signature wine. Tercos continues that legacy with their own Malbec, now in a keg as well as the traditional 750 ml glass bottle.

2021 Tercos Malbec



Argentina is best known throughout the world for its high quality Malbec. Tercos Malbec comes from estate vineyards that are grown in high elevations and harvested using traditional farming methods. Half of the wine spends eight months in French oak. Deep ruby in color followed by fruity aromatic characteristics of blackberry and cherry. In the mouth soft tannins punctuate the drinkability of a classic Argentine Malbec.

Wine in a keg is an emerging way to bring you the taste of wine as the winemaker intended. Kegged at peak freshness and stored airtight allows a longer shelf life. Share the savings with customers with reduced bottle packaging, transportation, and production costs, not to mention waste! One keg holds more than 25-750 ml bottles of wine and takes up less space.

Wine on tap will allow more efficient service, handle higher volumes, and bring a lower cost to you and your consumers while reducing your carbon footprint. Petainer kegs are more sustain-able because it holds a higher volume, with less packaging, and can be recycled when empty. These kegs use a universal coupling system, US Sankey D-system, so it is easy to set up and pour!
